



Philadelphia Watershed Stewardship Updates


This week is the fifth week of the Philadelphia Watershed


What is sustainability?

Aster Novi-Belgii, also known as the New York Aster, is a flower native to abandoned fields and wet meadows in eastern Canada and the northeastern United States. They feature daisy-like petals and bloom range of colors from a very light blue-ish purple, to a richer lavender color. They typically grow up to 15-28". The best part about the New York Aster is that they are attractive to butterflies!
